### School Description and Accreditation

John A. Rowland High School is a four-year comprehensive public high school in the Rowland Unified School District with an enrollment of 1,984 students. Each class period is 56 minutes long, meets 5 days a week, 18 weeks per semester. We are accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, and we are a Gold Ribbon School, California Distinguished School, and a National Blue Ribbon School. We have 6 counselors with a 335:1 counselor-to-student ratio.
